Summer Building Project Under Way

Summer is officially here, and our 2006 summer build is in full swing. On April 30 we broke ground on the 16th Habitat for Humanity home in Sheboygan County with a very soggy, but cheerful, ceremony. It's funny how a few shovels of dirt give way to a home in no time at all.

By mid-May our small hole in the grass became a much larger hole. Just days after the basement was dug, the concrete crews set forms and poured the foundation and walls. Now, where there was only a grass lot, there is the start of a home for a family to call its own.

The framing and rough carpentry will take place in July and August. Hammering, painting and dry walling are not the only needs that Habitat has during the building process. We also need volunteers to serve as hosts/hostesses in the morning or to prepare and serve lunches and refreshments to the construction volunteers. The Habitat ReStore, located in Plymouth, will celebrate its second anniversary this fall. Over the past year, the Habitat ReStore has kept 133,000 pounds of building materials out of area landfills because of faithful donations from the community.

Special items currently in the store that you should come in to see include antique lights and doors from a circa 1930 house, kitchen cabinets and new energy-efficient lights. We also have many doors that could be used to make a desk, workbench or perhaps even a headboard.

Additional volunteers are always needed to help cashier, assist customers, clean donated items, stock shelves and help with salvage projects as needed. The ReStore depends on donations of new and used building materials. Items may be dropped off during store hours or a home pickup can be arranged for larger items. 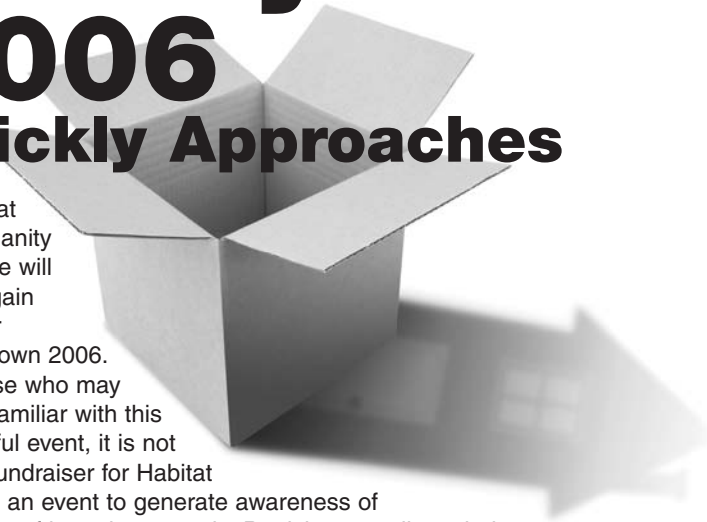
Shantytown 2006 Quickly Approaches

For those who may not be familiar with this wonderful event, it is not only a fundraiser for Habitat but also an event to generate awareness of the plight of homeless people. Participants collect pledges and donations for the "honor" of spending the night in a cardboard shanty they personally construct.

Shantytown 2006 is scheduled for Saturday, October 7. As a departure from previous years and as a way to create more awareness among local church attendees the following Sunday morning, youth groups will build and occupy cardboard shanties on their home church's property. A kickoff will be held the day of the event with groups heading back to their home church for the evening.

Spotlight on... Volunteer Opportunities

DATA ENTRY - This entails entering new and updated information into our databases via computer keyboard. Fast or slow, it doesn't make any difference as long as the input is correct. These tasks can be completed in our Habitat office, or we can make arrangements for volunteers to work at home.

RESEARCH - This is a task that comes up once a month or so but is needed relatively quickly when information is required. Some computer, Internet and phone skills are necessary. Again, these tasks can be completed at home or in our office.

BUILD SITE HOST/HOSTESS - This individual welcomes construction volunteers for the day and has them complete required waivers. Hosts make sure there is coffee and doughnuts in the morning and lead volunteers in an opening prayer prior to the day's work. Once the prayer is completed, volunteers are turned over to the crew leaders, and the host's job is finished for that day.

MAIL AND NEWSLETTER

COORDINATOR - This coordinator would affix labels to newsletters and other bulk mailings on an infrequent basis. Our Habitat newsletter goes out once a quarter and a bulk mailing goes out a couple times a year. This task can be completed at home or at our office.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS - Habitat for Humanity Lakeside is *ALWAYS* searching for individuals who would like to lend their expertise to our organization through participation on one or more of our committees. If you wish to learn more about our Public Relations, Family Selection, Family Partnering, Church Relations and/or Fund Development committees, please contact us.



Beginning this fall, the first of two financial programs will be held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Sheboygan Falls. Both programs are open to members and non-members of St. Paul's, but preregistration is required.

The first program to be presented is the **GOOD \$ENSE BUDGET COURSE**. It is a program using

biblical financial principles for transforming your finances and life. The **GOOD \$ENSE COURSE** is a six-session program designed as an introduction for individuals and families who want to get a better hold of their finances.

Although the word "BUDGET" is in the title, many other financial topics will be covered in the GOOD \$ENSE program. Some of them are Cultural Myths About Money, Prioritizing Financial Goals and The Spending Plan.

The **GOOD \$ENSE BUDGET COURSE** will be offered Sunday evenings, September 10, 17 and 24 and October 1, 8 and 15 from 6:30 to 7:45pm at St. Paul's, Sheboygan Falls in room 108.
